

James Pernotto Angles of Decadence

March 2 - April 19, 2008

James Pernotto's current work focuses on a search for a contemporary myth that connects the individual to the planet. The planet earth being a blue living space ship without borders. The themes that Pernotto is investigating in his work explore science and myth. These paintings combine two images, visually weaving them together. Hinged to DNA and natural harmonics, his recent work explores new two-dimensional depictions of space and time. Prime patterns, coupled with the shimmering light quality of the paint, draw analogies to primitive images as well as scientific data. All of this information is rushing about in a wild dance. A new direction in this work incorporates ancient script such as stone drum inscriptions from China (c. 200 B. C.) with symbols for DNA.





October 5th to November 14, 2008


Re-Veiling, by artists Ed Hallahan and Jacki Mountan was a another successful collaboration between two artists, two techniques, and two materials. Re-Veiling was a site specific installation of wood and cotton, which transformed the TAG gallery into a truly engaging space. Ed's "ladders" were cut and carved from white pine, then assembled in such a way that they became tall slender characters, that seemed to float on the walls and around the gallery. Jacki crocheted miles of cotton yarn into a garden of veils which covered the walls and grew down from the ceiling. When combined with Ed's work, the carefully tied netting became a transparent, scale like skin on bones of pine.

TAG was proud to bring art of this quality to its members and the public.










Don Drumm










People I've Met or Not Met July 12 to July 31, 2009






Ego Complex A Retrospective




Mine His Ours Paintings and Sculpture By Judy and Larry Griffiths March 13 to April 11, 2010






WELCOME TO MY WORLD

John W.Carlson and George F. Kocar both paint and draw the human figure. They have exhibited together previously, and both live in Bay Village - on the same street. But all similarity ends there. They paint in wildly different ways: thus the title CONTRAST.

John W. Carlson comes from a musical background but found his ultimate calling in the visual arts. He paints on large canvasses in soft muted tones, mostly in a symphony of subtle shades of grey and black. His subject is the human figure floating and engaging with others. He is searching, as he states, for the core, the emotional DNA, that thing which we respond to individually but are ultimately connected by.

George F. Kocar ,who holds an MFA from Syracuse University and teaches at Ashland University, has made himself a name with Kocar's Flying Banana Studio. He depicts contemporary life as a surreal carnival. With his hard-edged cartoon-like characters he criticizes, satirizes, and comments in screaming bright colors on our habits, addictions, and up-to-date preferences. No wonder that his exaggerated banana-nosed characters with the

oh-so-wild sunglasses have invaded not only serious modern art institutions but also American Greetings and The Rock and Roll Museum.

Larry Beckstein - Wildlife Artist

This exhibit at the Trumbull Art Gallery is Larry's first one-man exhibition and provides you with an opportunity to view the original paintings which serve as the basis for his limited-edition prints.

Larry grew up in wildlife-rich Northwestern Pennsylvania, where his ongoing love of the outdoors still motivates his work. Throughout his early years, he would take his sketchpad to the woods and streams, enjoying the feeling of being one-on-one with nature. There he sharpened his skills at drawing and painting, teaching himself what was needed to bring the outdoors to life on paper and canvas.



When he was younger, Larry would await the arrival of the Wild Wings catalog, as this gave him the opportunity to study other artists' techniques and styles. In 2004 he got the phone call all wildlife artists dream of; he became part of the Wild Wings family of artists.

Larry's specialties are working dogs and North American wildlife. He has produced over 100 limited-edition works of art, which have sold nationwide. He has been a contributing artist to Whitetails Unlimited, The Rocky Mountain Foundation, The National Wild Turkey Association,

and many other conservation organizations. He currently owns and operates Driftwood Gallery & Framing in Greenville, PA.

David Hume Kennerly - Pulitzer Prize Winning Photographer

Pulitzer Prize-winning photographer David Hume Kennerly visited Youngstown State University's College of Creative Arts and Communication for a reception, gallery talk and fundraising event in October, 2014. He donated 53 photographs from his newest collection "David Hume Kennerly On the iPhone", to support the creation of the David Hume Kennerly Scholarship in Art. This scholarship is geared toward Photography students at YSU.

That exhibition and the sale of Kennerly's photographs was successful, and the scholarship has now been established. The Trumbull Art Gallery is joining with the College of Creative Arts and Communication to extend Mr. Kennerly's exhibition into 2015. This exhibition of the remaining photographs is an opportunity for the residents of the Mahoning Valley to purchase these exceptional photographs while supporting YSU's College of Creative Arts and Communication and the Trumbull Art Gallery.

David Hume Kennerly won the 1972 Pulitzer Prize for his photos of the Vietnam War when he was 25, one of the youngest people to ever receive that honor. Two years later he was appointed President Gerald R. Ford's personal White House photographer. He was recently named, "One of the Most 100 Most Important People in Photography" by American Photo Magazine. He was a contributing editor for Newsweek, and a contributing photographer for Time and Life magazines, having shot more than 50 magazine covers and covered stories in more than 100 countries. He most recently produced "The President's Gatekeepers", about White House Chiefs of Staff, which ran on

the Discovery Channel in September 2013.







Juror's Statement:



Juror's Statement:


Many attempts have been made by writers on art and poetry to define beauty in the abstract, to express it in the most general terms, to find some universal formula for it.







ARTIST STATEMENT

Much of my work, although not all, has pertained to social inclusion/exclusion. In the past, issues such as racism and parenting an autistic child have been addressed.

The circus, in the context of the visual arts, has often been presented as a metaphor for the human condition. The circus is a non-traditional community that has always existed outside the mainstream of society.

With the creation of "Tightrope: Walk the Line", a wall installation that combines visual art with an original song, the most direct visual approach could have been executed by a much more literal interpretation of the song. However, I chose to come from an entirely different angle by drawing a parallel between the circus world and a group of people that society also looks upon as existing outside the mainstream: the trans* community.

Though much has changed for the trans* community in the last few years, with regard to the public's awareness, there is still a measure of societal ignorance and discomfort about the struggles these individuals endure to become the people they believe they were always meant to be.

I am not a trans*, but speaking from the perspective of an ally, and based upon readings and interviews I conducted with trans* individuals, I have attempted to express the frustration, anger, and isolation that can often be part of living as a trans* human being through the creation of this work.


